Osborne Park Hospital has specialist services including: Rehabilitation and sub-acute services for younger and older adults, general medicine, theatres, elective general and specialist surgery, endoscopy and day procedure unit as well as obstetric and gynaecological services on site.

Osborne Park Hospital is easily accessible from the Mitchell Freeway and only 13 kilometres from Perth CBD. There are good transport networks around the hospital and free parking is available to staff and visitors.

Why choose Osborne Park Hospital Graduate Nurse Program?

Graduate Enrolled Nurses at Osborne Park Hospital are given the opportunity to optimise their personal growth and consolidate their professional practice and development in a welcoming and supportive environment. This enables smooth transition from student nurse to practicing Enrolled Nurse.

Each clinical area has a designated Staff Development Nurse to support new graduates.

The innovative and dynamic practice rotations offered as part of the program provide graduate nurses with unlimited opportunities for professional advancement in a variety of areas.



The program includes 2 x 6 month Rehabilitation rotations with a period spent in the Surgical Day Procedure Unit:

- Day Procedure Unit.
- Rehabilitation Aged Care (RAC) Wards 3, 4 and 5 with younger adults on Ward 4.

Graduate Program inclusions:

- Two weeks supernumerary time is provided for hospital induction and orientation on commencement of the program. (Pro Rata)
- Monthly graduate network / education sessions for peer support, clinical and professional development.
- Two Professional Development Courses: Rehabilitation and Diabetes back to basics course.
- Supernumerary clinical practice at the commencement of each new rotation.
- Annual leave negotiated at start of program.
- Fixed term contract for 12 months.

All graduates who complete their program at Osborne Park Hospital are welcome to apply for further employment if positions become available near completion of the program via the www.jobs.wa.gov.au website.
