- Decide how much time you want to allocate to your project (either utilising rostered Teaching, Training and Research (TTR) time, Professional Development Leave, or additional out of work hours)
- Find a project question/topic and a supervisor by speaking to a senior colleague about existing projects or about your own ideas and review the literature around your project.
 - The <u>National Safety and Quality Health Service Standards</u> are a good starting point when brainstorming quality improvement project ideas!

| WAHTN's training platform (the <u>RETprogram</u>) is funded by the WA Department of Health and delivers <u>online research training courses</u>, free for SCGOPHCG employees. Good Clinical Practice (GCP) certification is internationally recognised and designed to support researchers apply these principles in research. It's required for clinical trial investigators in WA. Certification is free and available via the RETprogram or <u>Global Health Trials</u>. |

| Provides access to many online databases, journals, and textbooks. Offers training sessions for literature searches and using endnote. Provides services to help with obtaining books or articles and doing literature searches. |
| The CAHS Research Education Program (REP) offers Friday lunchtime seminars throughout the year, available through MS Teams or in-person at Perth Children's Hospital. The seminar schedule and past recordings are available online <u>here</u>. The REP also runs research workshops throughout the year, and has useful online resources available for research and clinical audits <u>here</u>. | REDCap is a secure, web-based data collection and management tool that is supported by the WA Department of Health and is the database of choice at the SCGOPHCG.
