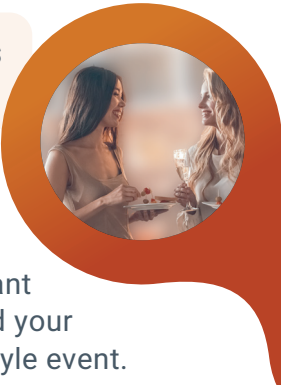


Research careers evening: Q&A panel and award ceremony 4pm - 5pm
